## Science & Engineering Library

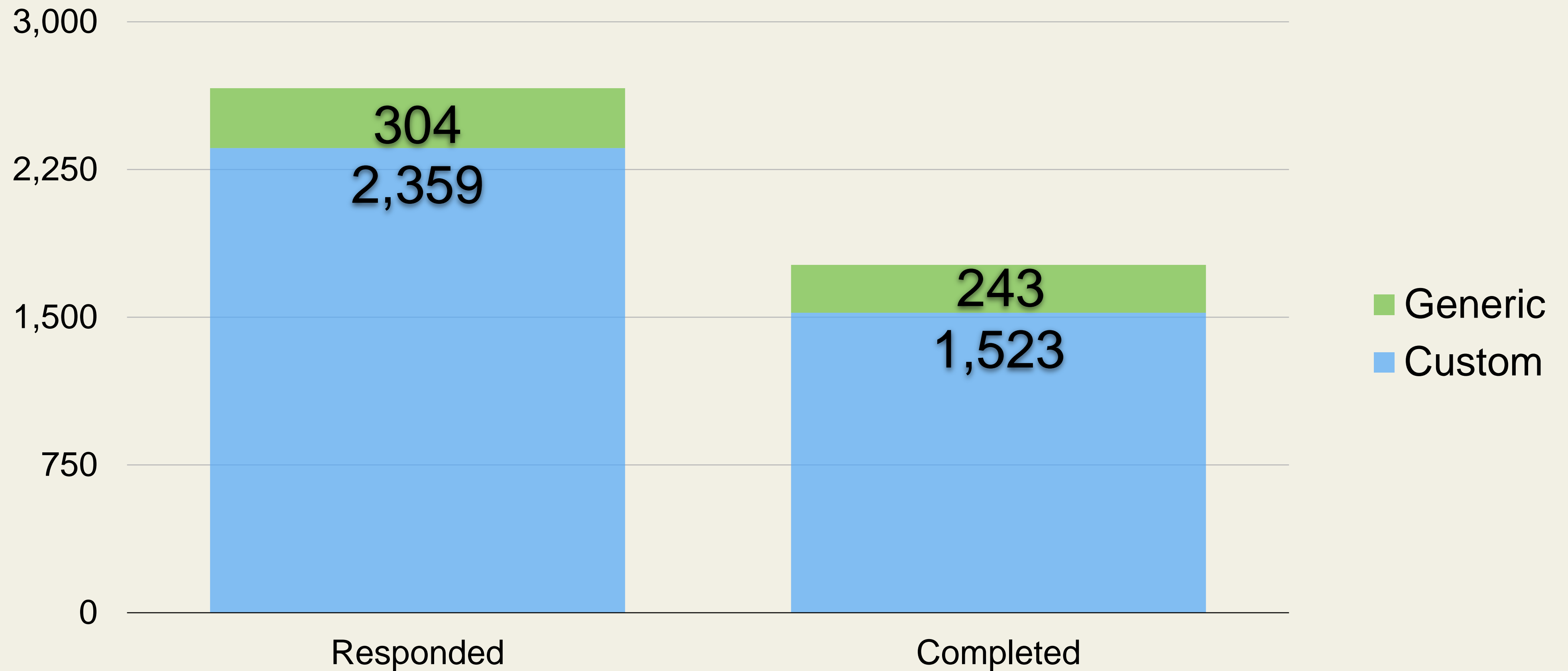
- Opened in 1991

- 245,000 volumes
- 860 seats
- 65 public computers
- 8 reservable study rooms
- No café

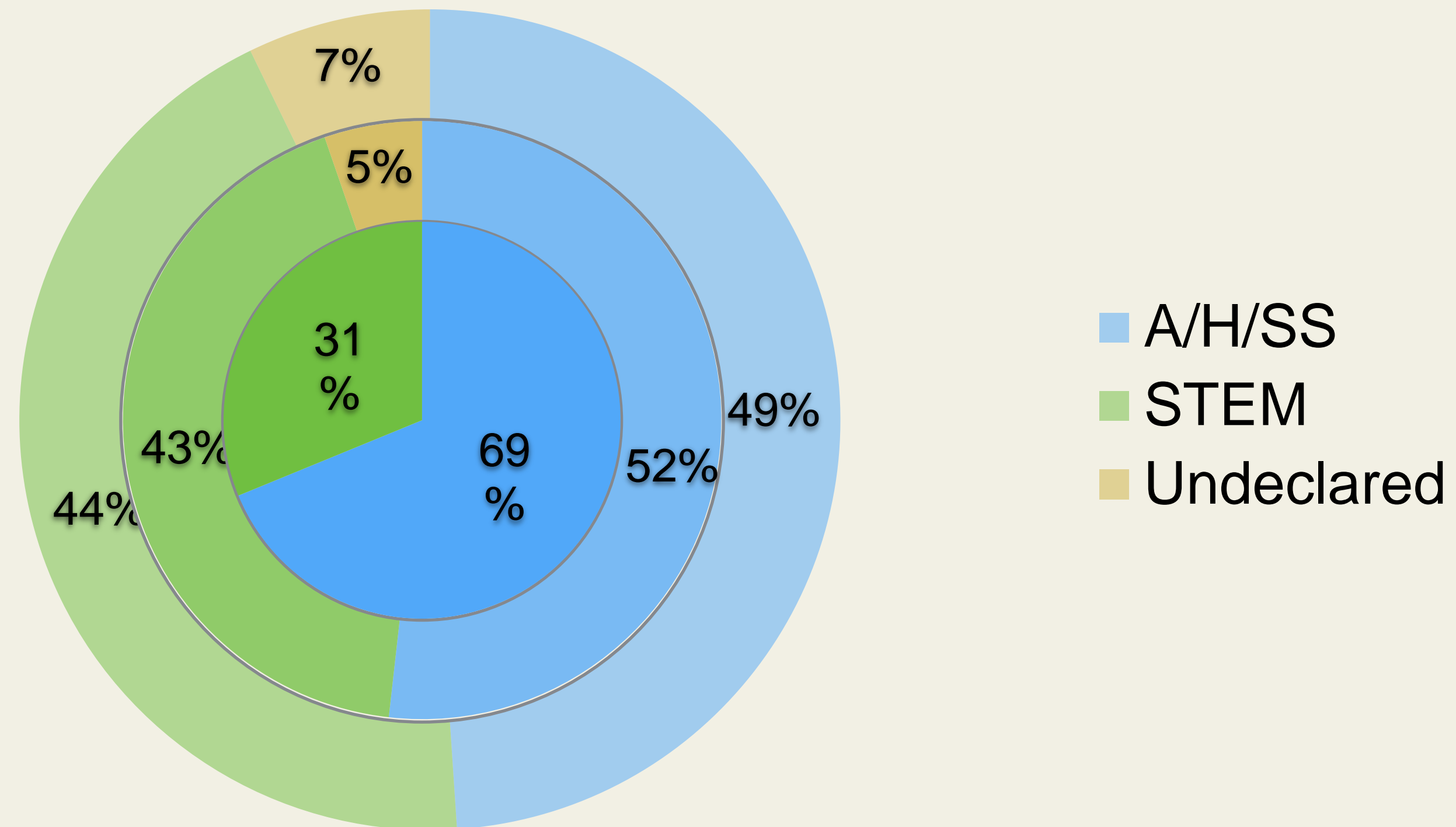

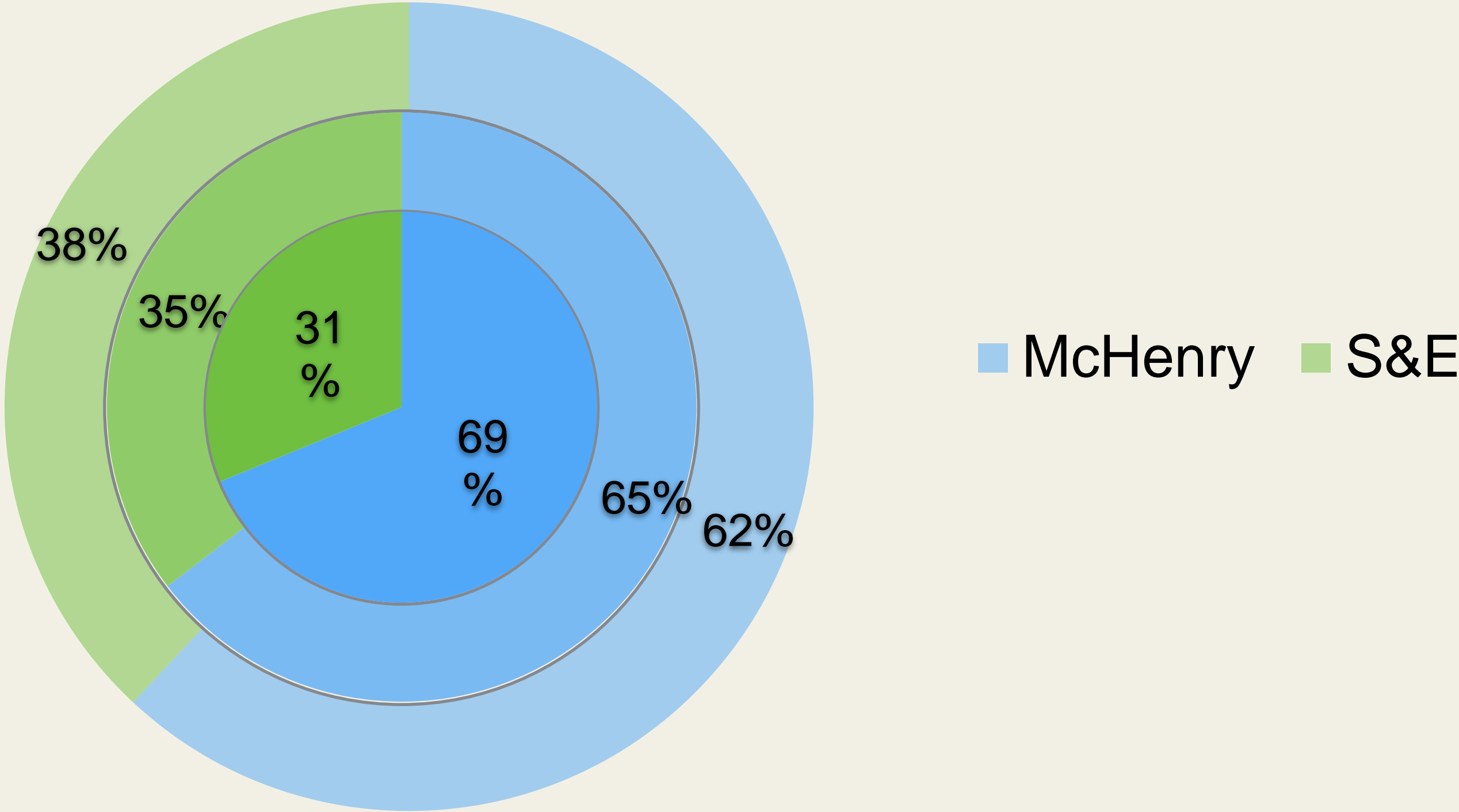


# Capacity vs. use

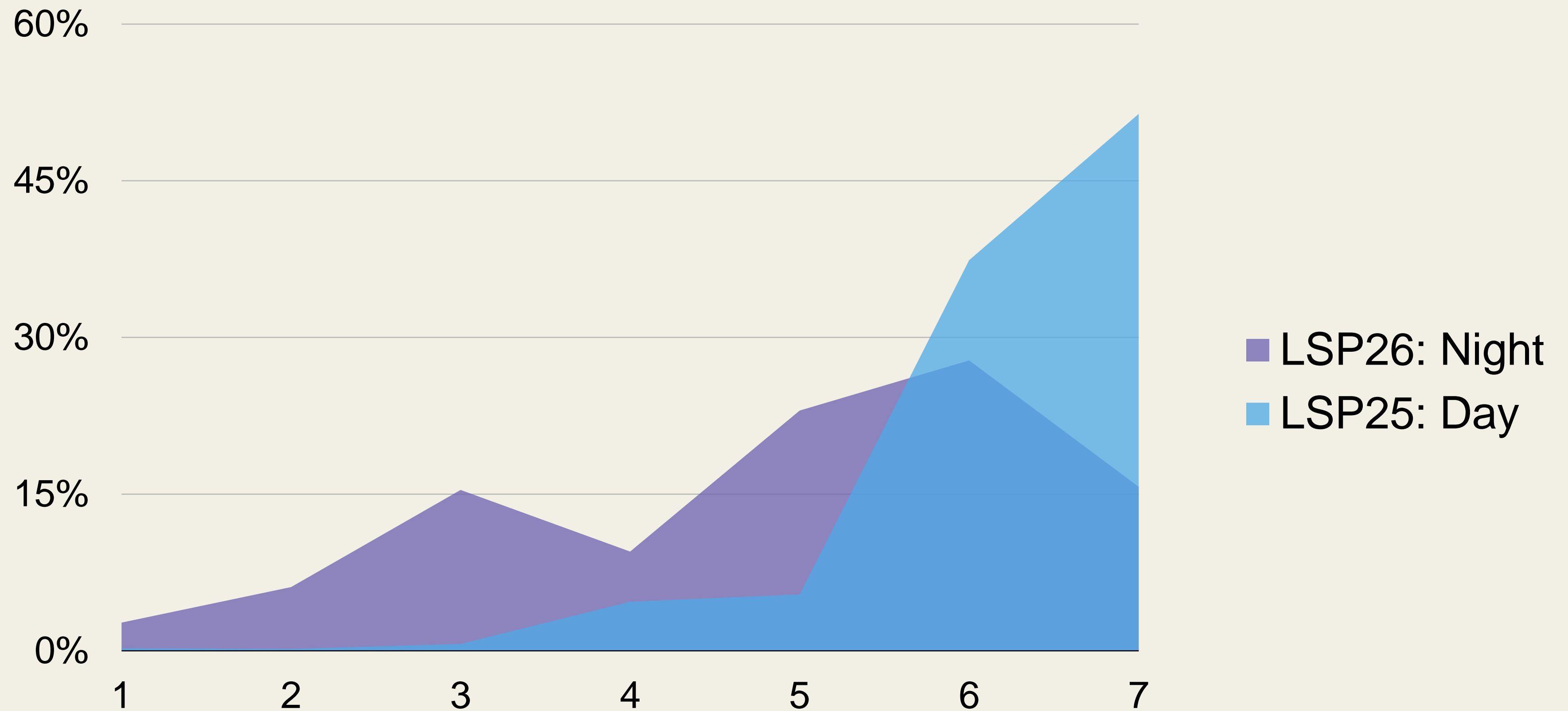

# Convenience and safety (night)



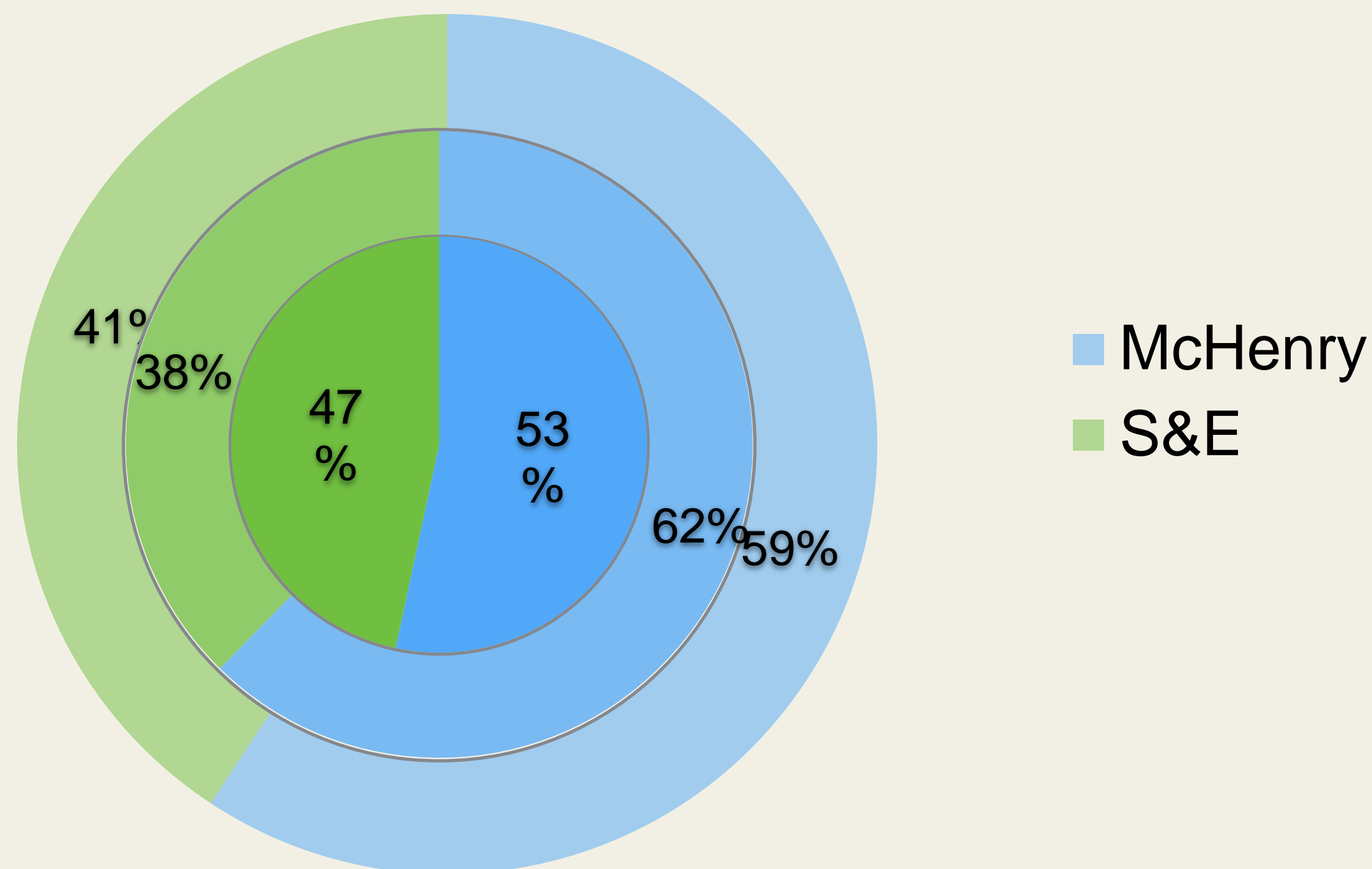


# Headcount at night
